IN HONOUR OF CHARLIE

When Charlie arrived 13 weeks early, weighing just 1 lb 10 oz, his parents' world changed overnight.

Their expectations for birth and new parenthood were replaced with a 14 week journey that began at the Sunnybrook Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). At times, bringing Charlie home felt almost impossible. But 8 weeks after being born, he was transitioned to the NICU at Lakeridge Health Oshawa, just 10 minutes from home.

Charlie's mom, Dr. Sarah Ritchie, practices Family Medicine Obstetrics at Lakeridge Health, caring for mothers and babies every day. When roles were reversed and Sarah became a NICU parent herself, she experienced firsthand how compassionate staff and vital, donor-funded equipment make all the difference for families.

"Experiencing Charlie's journey as a parent gave me a new perspective on our team's incredible dedication. It made me so proud to be part of this community." Sarah shared.

Thanks to generous donor support, Charlie received life-saving care close to home. High-flow oxygen machines, funded by community donations, made his early transfer to Lakeridge Health possible. Community support has also funded other essential equipment for the NICU, like the biliblanket system which is used to manage jaundice.

"It meant so much to our family to be near home while Charlie grew stronger." Sarah said.

Today, Charlie is thriving, recently celebrating his first birthday – a milestone that once seemed impossible. His family celebrated by making a donation to the NICU in his honour and asking others to do the same.

Turning the Never into Now

For Wesley and his family, a visit to Grandview Kids can bring feelings of both comfort and fear. Born with cerebral palsy, Wesley visits the beloved Ajax-based children's treatment centre three times per year for procedures to relieve his muscle spasms, some of which involve up to 11 injections per session without sedation.

Though necessary, it can be an uncomfortable experience.

"My son shouldn't be afraid of what makes him feel better," says Wesley's mom Abby. And Wesley isn't alone. Due to long wait times and a lack of local services, children and youth with physical, developmental and communication needs in our community are turned away from traditional hospital settings, sometimes multiple times, when they seek urgent accessible medical procedures with sedation.

To help address this issue, this past spring Lakeridge Health and Grandview Kids launched a first-of-its-kind partnership with plans for a unique outpatient procedure room to provide urgently needed sedation-supported care for Grandview Kids clients.


"When we first heard about this project, we were so excited to have this much-needed service close to home. We were so relieved," says Abby. "It's hard watching your child go through so much, and not being able to get the right care when they need it."

To make this goal a reality, our Foundation asked for your help. Hundreds of donors in our community, including the O'Regan and Yetman Families who generously matched all gifts to support this initiative up to \$50,000, came together to help raise support for the tools needed to equip this room for sedation-supported care.

Once all equipment is fully funded, this new service will allow Lakeridge Health's expert medical staff, including an anesthesiologist, pediatrician, and surgical nurses to perform medical procedures on-site at the Grandview Kids new headquarters in Ajax once per month, increasing access to care by 4x.

We've reached **\$300,000** of our \$1 million goal to support the exciting Lakeridge Health-Grandview Kids partnership but there's still a ways to go!

On the first floor of our Whitby Hospital, you'll hear the whir of treadmills and stationary bicycles coming from the Respiratory Rehabilitation Clinic.

This clinic supports many patients as they learn to control their breathing and exercise safely to support their recovery after a medical procedure or treatment.

One such patient, John, found himself at the Respiratory Rehab Clinic after being diagnosed with pulmonary fibrosis, a condition that affects the lungs and makes it difficult to breathe.

John required therapy and specialized care at the Whitby Hospital to qualify for a lung transplant, and while completing

his therapy learned of the need for a new specialized treadmill. John and his wife Marilyn decided to generously fund this equipment as a gift of thanks for the excellent care he received.

With John and Marilyn's donation, the Clinic has been able to increase the number of patients they can support from 12 to 18 per day.
